Orientation for Prospective Students

One of Roma Tre University's institutional tasks is to promote and implement orientation for prospective students with the primary objective to allow them to choose their course of studies and decide on their future career, responsibly.

With this purpose in mind, the University's [Orientation Office](#) has been carrying, for many years, the following initiatives:

Secondary (High) schools wishing to receive information can contact the Orientation Office indicating the name of the school, any potential course of studies of interest, main correspondence address and those of any branches, the school's director and delegate for outgoing orientation, telephone number, fax and email of the school and of the delegate. Once this data is made available, the school will be included in a mailing list and informed of all the initiatives promoted by our University.

As part of the orientation activities for prospective students, the Orientation Office is present at events such as the [Roma Tre University's Orientation Day](#) and external events such as the [Student Fair](#).

The [Working Group on University Orientation](#) (GLOA), in collaboration with the Orientation Office promotes and coordinates orientation policies for prospective students.



Innovation, industrial research and development projects

Roma Tre University is committed to promoting projects concerning process innovation, the organization of SMEs, industrial research and experimentation consistent with the principles of Industry 4.0.

In particular, the university aims to develop Industry 4.0 compliant industrial research projects and solutions that, through technology transfer initiatives, address the management of the security and privacy of infrastructures, systems and services.

The Prorector for Innovation is also focused on the development of an innovation, start-up support and technology transfer ecosystem across the Lazio Region, with a view to promoting:

- Dialogue, collaboration and synergies among all stakeholders, including universities, research centres, young graduates, undergraduates, companies, trade associations, public and private incubators and accelerators, institutions, chambers of commerce, investors, financiers and so on.
- The identification and development of technological and innovative trajectories that can stimulate regional economic growth and excellence. Example include the university's proposal to establish a regional cyber security competence centre and its participation as a key research organization in the Lazio Region's Call for [Strategic Projects](#).



Research and Consultancy Contracts

Among the university's essential tools of knowledge transfer and direct interaction with society are its third-party commissioned services and commercial activities, that is the monetization of the knowledge produced by the university (as per Article 66 of Italian Presidential Decree 382/80 – Commissioned Research and Consultancy, and Article 49 of Royal Decree 1592/1933 – Tariffed Services – Revenue for educational activities, seminars and conferences carried out on behalf of third parties).

The university supports the development of third-party activities in all disciplinary areas under the conviction idea that the commercial monetization of knowledge can also produce public and social assets of high innovative value.

A concrete example of this is the employment contract certification and work dispute mediation services offered by the [University Contract Certification Commission](#), which was established in the university's Department of Economics under the Italian Ministry of Labour Decree No. 21/2011, and quickly assumed a leading role at the national level.

Libraries

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Some libraries are organised into sections located in the different university locations and perceived in order to be as close as possible to students and professors.

In addition to the University Library System, Roma Tre owns other important libraries, as for example the “Guillaume Apollinaire” library, located in the Italian-French Studies Centre.

Funding from competitive tenders generally foresees a public call for proposal characterised by the participation of several subjects (universities, public/private foundations and institutions, research institutions, departments, research groups or units etc.) and by a selection through a refereeing system.

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Research Agency

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Roma Tre promotes and supports basic research in all its scientific-disciplinary areas, enhancing its original and innovative contents. Roma Tre also promotes applied research focused on the development and transfer of new technologies, always respecting the aims and responsibilities deriving from its public nature.

The Research Agency was established in April 2018 with the aim of pursuing those objectives. The Agency consists of two offices: the [National Research Office](#) and the [European and International Research Office](#).

The Research Agency ensures an integrated and efficient advisory system, management and professional support, for the Departments and academic community, necessary for the administration, improvement and enhancement of the research activities through promotional activities, counselling, editing management and support, project dealing and management, both planning and implementation stage, in the reporting and internal audit of financed contracts, as well as information activities and updating regarding new opportunities and funding models in European and international fields.

Research Development

For an idea to come to fruition requires not only the hard work of university researchers and university, but also the collaboration of industrial partners and other external parties interested in the development and industrialization of scientific research products and investors interested in financing research, development and marketing activities. During this last phase of development, it is especially important to consider the original research aims that lead to the conception and marketing of the idea or product, as well as respect for individuals, progress in society, youth development, focused particularly on recent graduates, doctoral students and scholarship recipients, youth employment, and sustainable development that respects nature and the environment.

Significant positive impacts on society can only be achieved through strong ties with institutions governing industrial policy and regulating public and private research and economic development funding. Accordingly, Roma Tre University aims to play a primary role in relations with companies and investors throughout all phases of the complex process leading from original conception to industrialization of the final product.

To this end, various strategic and operational meetings with the top management of major Italian and foreign productive, economic and professional parties with interests in Italy are ongoing and will be further intensified through the “**Roma Tre Meets the Business World**” initiative.



Statute and regulations

Roma Tre University [Statuto](#) provides for the general principles concerning the organisation and operation of the University. Under the Constitution and under law no. 168 of 1989, the statute represents the highest degree of autonomy for the University. Approved by the Academic Senate, following the favourable opinion from the Board of Trustees, it is then issued by the Rector after the completion of the ministerial control procedure, as provided by art. 6 of law no. 168 of 1989.

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Departments and Schools

Roma Tre University is organized in:

- **12 departments** that manage, coordinate, plan and promote scientific research as well as teaching and training activities. Departments are responsible for carrying on the development of the following functions:
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 - other educational activities;
 - external activities related to research and teaching or aimed at enhancing and disseminating the activities and competences of the Departments themselves, including partnership, spin-off and start-up initiatives.

Two or more departments can submit to the Academic Senate the proposal of setting up a school, owing the function to coordinate and rationalise teaching activities.

- **2 schools** that, in order to provide high organisational and qualitative standards and to ensure the perfect sustainability of study programmes, coordinate the teaching programming guidelines and the proposals for activating specific courses in the departmental academic offer. They also give advice and remarks concerning teaching staff recruitment, assessing the compatibility and functionality of recruitment proposals in relation to teaching planning and academic offer.



History and Values

Roma Tre University is a **young university thought for young people**. Founded in 1992, it has rapidly grown in terms of enrolments as well as in the number of academic courses offered. It has gained a very good reputation in the most prominent academic rankings, especially among the most recently founded institutions.

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A dynamic, modern and international university that has immediately characterised as the vital lever of the capital's urban development, within which it is now deeply rooted, contributing in changing the city's identity with a persevering process of restructuring and re-using abandoned industrial buildings, converting them into factories of knowledge and research.

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Start-ups and self-entrepreneurship

The promotion of entrepreneurial culture and innovative start-ups is an important strategic objective of the university.

The project **Dock3**, launched in 2018, constitutes its flagship initiative in this regard. Dock 3 involves students from all departments in a multi-stage process that aims to encourage students and young researchers to become aware of their talents and to enter and play an active part in the ecosystem of innovative start-ups.

The university is also engaged in the preparation of a pre-accelerator, equipped with suitable spaces and equipment, as well as in the establishment of a coordination table with the major universities in Rome and with local institutions in order to exploit all possible synergies in favour of young people wanting to create a start-up.



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Research Repository

The evaluation of the research activities carried out in universities has gained significant importance both for the entire university system as well as within each single university. Roma Tre has hence looked at the possibility of providing the University with suitable information tools that could best support the monitoring and evaluation of the research activities carried out in its departments. Among these the creation of a University Research Repository was considered particularly important.

The Research Repository is meant to fulfil other fundamental needs in addition to its primary use, in order for it to significantly contribute to the development of the university. Research Universities should be able to more and more successfully dialogue with the economic and productive reality of the country. The university departments should disseminate to the productive world the issues the research is being facing and their results.

The repository allows to find, with reference to both the individual researcher and the various research groups, information related to ‘research products’ such as:

- Publications of books;
- Publications of chapters or essays in books;
- Publication of articles in scientific reviews;
- Publication of articles on conference proceedings;
- Other products (patents, projects, multi-media products etc.).



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
