The evaluation of the research activities carried out in universities has gained significant importance both for the entire university system as well as within each single university. Roma Tre has hence looked at the possibility of providing the University with suitable information tools that could best support the monitoring and evaluation of the research activities carried out in its departments. Among these the creation of a University Research Repository was considered particularly important.

The Research Repository is meant to fulfil other fundamental needs in addition to its primary use, in order for it to significantly contribute to the development of the university.

PHD Programmes

The PhD represents the highest academic degree awarded by Italian universities. The PhD title is awarded after the completion of a three year-study and research program whose access is regulated by a call for admissions. Admission to a PhD course is reserved to applicants holding a Master's degree or a Single Cycle Degree. Citizens of any state and without age limits are admitted, provided that the qualification obtained has been previously recognized as equivalent to an Italian academic qualification.

Every year the Italian Ministry of Education, University and Research arranges for the accreditation of courses that can be activated; each University, upon proposal of the Departments, establishes courses, number of places and number of scholarships.

Roma Tre offers a wide range of PhD courses particularly in the fields in which the University is developing a specific, wide, qualified and continuous research activity recognized at international level.

Roma Tre University, in synergy with its departments, the Job Placement Office and the Internships Office, promotes and strengthens outgoing orientation, job placement, and labour supply and demand intermediation services, and the quantity and quality of curricular and extracurricular internships and apprenticeships.
