Departments and Schools

Roma Tre University is organized in:

- 12 <u>departments</u> that manage, coordinate, plan and promote scientific research as well as teaching and training activities. Departments are responsible for carrying on the development of the following functions:
 - research;
 - teaching and training activities related to Bachelor's and Master's degrees as well as PhDs;
 - other educational activities;
 - external activities related to research and teaching or aimed at enhancing and disseminating the activities and competences of the Departments themselves, including partnership, spin-off and start-up initiatives.

Two or more departments can submit to the Academic Senate the proposal of setting up a school, owing the function to coordinate and rationalise teaching activities.

PhDs

A PhD represents the highest academic degree awarded by Italian universities. The PhD title is awarded after the completion of a three year-study and research programme whose access is regulated by a call for admissions. Admission to a PhD course is reserved to applicants holding a Master's degree. Citizens of any state and without age limits are admitted, provided that the qualification obtained has been previously recognised as equivalent to an Italian academic qualification. Every year the Italian Ministry of Education, University and Reserach states on the accreditation of courses that can be activated; each University, upon proposal of the Departments, establishes courses, number of places and number of scholarships.

Roma Tre offers a wide range of PhD courses in the sectors in which it develops a specific, wide, qualified and continuous research activity recognised all over the world.

Example include the university's proposal to establish a regional cyber security competence centre and its participation as a key research organization in the Lazio Region's Call for <u>Strategic Projects</u>.
